Dr. Nelson reported that the state no longer requires the every 6 month defib training and as the first responders' medical director, he is not going to require it. However, he still strongly suggests that units do some type of education every 6 months in their own units as this is a vital skill to know well and be able to perform correctly.

 - h. **Dispatch**: More hires/people leaving. Hoping to be fully staffed with a stable staff soon.
 - Website: Mark Knier will continue to be our webmaster.
 - **EMD Steering committee:** Be sure to send rip and run issues to dispatch ASAP.
